



## The Chicago Temple Centennial Celebration 2024 Calendar of Events

### **June 15 and September 21 – Walking tour of Rosehill Cemetery**

*A tour visiting the graves of church members who were instrumental in building the Chicago Temple. Meet inside the Ravenswood Avenue entrance of Rosehill Cemetery (5800 North Ravenswood Avenue) at 10 a.m. The tour lasts approximately two hours.*

### **September 28 – Chicago Temple architectural symposium**

*A moderated discussion on the architectural significance of the Chicago Temple featuring Lee Bey, Robert Brueggemann, Rebekah Coffman, Adam Rubin and Thomas Leslie. Program begins at 2 p.m. in the sanctuary of First United Methodist Church.*

### **September 29 – Morning worship**

*Sunday morning worship services will remember the formal dedication of the Chicago Temple that took place on September 28, 1924. David Worthington, The United Methodist Church's Global Ambassador of Methodist Heritage Sites will speak. Services take place at 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. in the sanctuary of First United Methodist Church.
